^{*}Plenary Sessions introduce the issue and set the scene for deeper discussions in the Ministerial Dialogues through inspiring top-level questions and interventions.

In Ministerial Dialogues:

- Good practices and specific bottlenecks that countries are facing are shared, solutions are discussed, and opportunities for action at national level emerge.
- For each dialogue topic, ministers will be asked in advance 1) what are their top concerns, and 2) what are the good experiences that they must share.
- Dialogues are monitored to identify key action points.
- All Dialogues to elevate importance of elimination of inequalities and gender.







^{**}Ministerial Dialogues are in depth open discussions, between ministers as peers, and leaders from other constituencies, supported by senior facilitators and resource people. They will be taking place in eight parallel groups of 10-15 participants each, discussing the same topic at the same time but potentially drawing upon different examples depending on the ministers present in every room. Each dialogue will start by highlighting one or two specific issues/challenges that requires ministerial attention to fix, relating to climate, covid/health and economy.
